Laszlo Benő Vanyi, a devoted husband, loving father and grandfather, respected craftsman, and faithful servant of God, passed away peacefully on May 12, 2026, at the age of 91.

Born in Cegléd, Hungary, on March 28, 1935, Laszlo was raised in his beloved homeland before courageously emigrating to the United States in 1957 in search of new opportunities and a better future for his family. He first settled in New York City and later made his home in Fair Lawn, New Jersey in 1988, where he remained for the rest of his life.

A proud veteran of the Hungarian Air Force, Laszlo served during the 1956 Hungarian Revolution, carrying with him throughout his life a deep sense of resilience, patriotism, and faith. Following his arrival in America, he built a successful career in the construction industry as a self-employed contractor, earning the admiration of many through his hard work, honesty, and dedication. He retired in 1995 after many years of devoted labor.

He was an active and cherished member, serving as Chief Elder of the Hungarian Reformed Church of New York City. His unwavering faith guided every aspect of his life and served as an inspiration to all who knew him.

In his free time, Laszlo found great joy in gardening and caring for his home and family. He treasured time spent with loved ones and was known for his wisdom, quiet strength, generosity, and steadfast devotion to those he loved.

Laszlo shared 61 beautiful years of marriage with his beloved wife, Jacqueline Henriette Vanyi (nee Robin). Together they built a loving family that remained the center of his life.

He is survived by his loving wife, Jacqueline Henriette Vanyi; his son, Andre Laszlo Vanyi and his wife, Yolanda; and his cherished grandchildren, Noelle and Adrian Vanyi. He is also survived by his dear nephews, Edith, Pisti, and Janos.

He was predeceased by his siblings, Itza and Miklos Vanyi.
