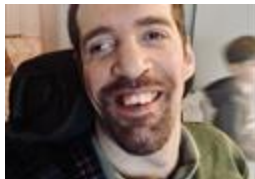

He was a magnet for joy and sunshine. And that's how I remember my brother. A bright light.

He needed so much help physically, but he was never a burden. It was a privilege to serve him physically, and I was incredibly blessed

to BE lovingly served by him intellectually, emotionally, and spiritually.

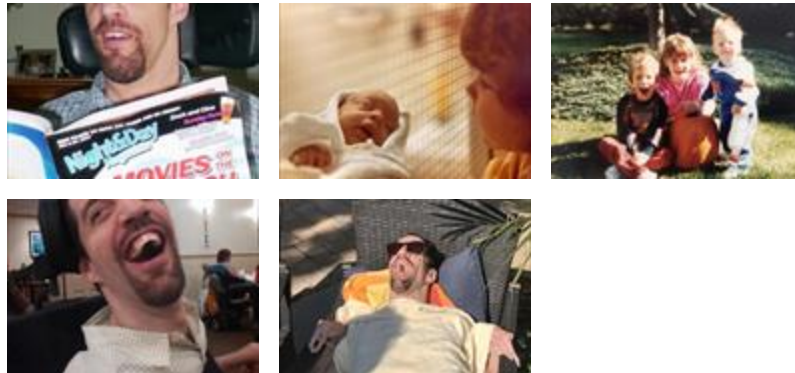

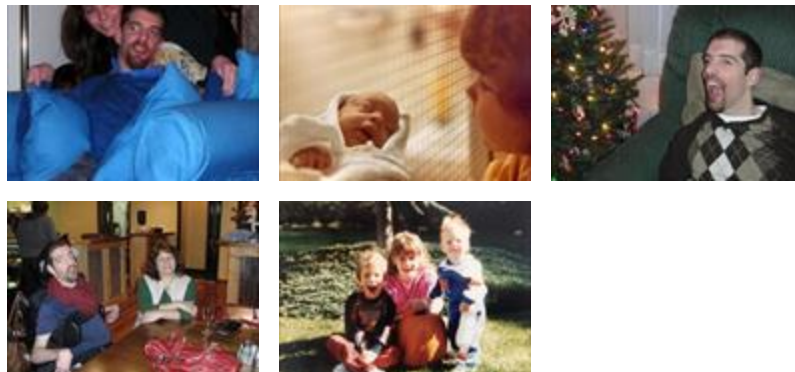
